A new pattern of services

Our new pattern of services continues today with our **10am** service. From time to time this will incorporate the pattern of service from the Book of Common Prayer. Holy Communion will be celebrated on the first and third Sundays, Morning Prayer and other forms on second, fourth and fifth Sundays. When there is no Communion here, it is always available at St Peter's, Glenfield.

These services will be live-streamed whenever possible, though the training for this is ongoing and it may take a couple of weeks to settle in.

The midweek Holy Communion service on the first Thursday of the month will resume on 7 October at 10am.

We will be celebrating Harvest on Sunday 26 September at our 10am service. Jane Woolmer will be speaking, helping us thank God for his good gifts and focus on our role as stewards of his creation. Through the Autumn, following this celebration, Jane will be running a course in church to explore and encourage an eco-sustainable lifestyle. Details to follow soon.

Following the 10am service, there will be a **picnic** in the field behind church (thanks to permission from Bradgate Park Trust) at 12.30pm. Do bring your own food and drink – and seats if needed – and join with others in the congregation to enjoy the goodness of God's provision together.

Ongoing Covid measures

As we move to a new time and format of service, we are continuing with measures to minimise the risk of infection spread at our church. Rates of local infection are still high.

Though social distancing is now optional, we are keeping the south side of church reserved for those who wish to continue. We also strongly request and encourage the wearing of face masks when entering or leaving church, when coming forward for Communion and while singing. It continues to be the case that you should **not attend** services if you have any COVID-19 symptoms, nor if you are self-isolating because of contact with a suspected case.

While many want to take advantage of the freedom now granted, we need to bear in mind, as the Bishop of London says, that:

Taking personal responsibility means responsibility for our neighbour, not just for ourselves, and taking precautions to protect those more vulnerable than we consider ourselves to be.

Some of us have become well accustomed to being in a church service, for others this will now feel a new and risky step, so in St Paul's words about our imitation of Christ, please 'in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others'.

We are encouraged to still collect name and contact information of those who attend in case this needs to be supplied to the NHS 'Test and Trace' programme. The toilet will be available, but please clean anything you touch after use.
